

'We can rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials.' Romans 5:3 NLT



In World War II, Viktor Frankl was sentenced to a Nazi concentration camp. The guards deprived him of everything. They took his wife, his family, and his clothes. They even stole his wedding ring. But he had one thing no one could take from him.

In a classic book, he wrote, 'The last of human freedoms is the ability to choose one's attitude in a given set of circumstances.' The guards could not take from Frankl his freedom to choose his attitude.

We do not know what is going to occur tomorrow or even today. We can't control all our circumstances, but we can control how we respond to them. We can control whether an experience makes us stronger or weaker, increases our faith or our fear, makes us a better person or a bitter person. The saying goes: 'The same sunshine that melts the butter hardens the clay.' God wants our struggles to strengthen us.

In (Romans 5: 3-5 NLT) Paul writes:

'We can rejoice too, when we run into problems and trials, for we know that they help us develop endurance. And endurance develops strength of character, and character strengthens our confident hope of salvation. And this hope will not lead to disappointment. St John's continues to encourage a love of reading for both recreation and pleasure by supporting those students who take part in the Premier's Reading Challenge.





What is the Premier's Reading Challenge?

The Challenge is a literacy engagement strategy that requires students to read 12 age appropriate books in a year. Students who complete the challenge receive an annual award.

What must students do:

20 books: - students are challenged to read 20 books from the start of the year until Week 7, Term 3. Teachers will record the titles of the books read onto the Student Reading Report. If your child/ren has read a book at home, please send in a signed note detailing the title and author.

Number of free choice books

Students will read 8 of the 20 books from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist.

Awards - the 'Olympics of reading' and beyond...

Students who complete the Challenge receive awards from the Premier for their achievements in a similar fashion to sporting stars!



Awards for completing the Challenge are:

Certificate – first year
Bronze medal – second year
Silver medal – third year
Gold medal - fourth year
Champion medal – fifth year
Legend medal – sixth year
Hall of Fame medal – seventh year

Hall of Fame Reader for Life – eighth year onwards reflecting the number of years participated up to the final, fourteenth year.

The afternoon's tabloid events were very hotly contested and involved all students from Foundation to Year Six enjoying activities such as peg collect, tube race and the hoop relay.

The day's swimming events concluded with the ever popular students, teachers and parents relay.

At the end of the day's events the results were announced with Thiele finishing up on 374 points and Emmaus on 318 points.

Ms Karen Leese presented the St John's Swimming Shield (donated by the Hambour family) to the Thiele House Captains Bridget Williams and Julia l'Anson and Vice-Captains Marty Mosey and Harry Niemz. Both captains responded on behalf of their houses, thanking the organisers, parent helpers and teachers.

It was terrific to see the exceptional turn out of parents who attended the carnival, assisted with the events and supported their children.

Additional thanks go to all staff and parents who had assisted on the day, with a special mention to the Parents and Friends for providing us with lunch. I also wish to comment on the terrific participation of the students who supported and encouraged each other throughout the day. Well done!


